## Who fights to help make your life great?

Twelve Youth Art Team summer camp students created and installed 30 silhouettes in a Waterloo Center for the Arts Urban Gallery during one week in July 2017. Young artists will gradually transform these silhouettes to represent actual people whose lives make our community great. In addition, young writers, musicians, and artists will create a short video telling the story of each person who is selected for the gallery. All submissions may be published in a collection at the end of the project.

**Now we need to hear from you:** Who makes your life great? Who do you think deserves recognition in the Urban Gallery? Students developed a list of criteria to set the stage for you! You can find these on the next page.

The Youth Art Team is accepting submissions from the public. Students ages 5-18 will review submissions and choose who will have the honor of recognition in the Urban Gallery. Make sure to check out their criteria on the back of this sheet.

## Eligibility – Who qualifies?

To be considered for the Urban Gallery, the person:

- may be living (any age) or deceased.
- does not need to be well-known or famous. (Under-recognized people may even have a better chance of being selected.)
- may live in Waterloo, Cedar Falls, and surrounding towns – or not! (If not, explain why you think this person makes our community here great. The more we understand their connection, the more likely they are to be selected for the gallery.)
- cannot be yourself. (If you want to be considered, find someone who thinks you're great and ask them to complete a form!)
- can be your friend, relative, etc. (examples: spouse, child, parent, cousin, teacher, neighbor, mentor, co-worker, etc.).

## Criteria – Who will be chosen?

Students decided that those selected for the Urban Gallery will be people who:

- do small things to make a bigger impact.
- show compassion.
- love people for who they are.
- influence other people.
- make other people feel safe.
- change lives.
- are fun or funny.
- are selfless.
- accept others.
- show love to others.

## Tips

- Tell your story! Help us imagine this person who makes us great. The more we feel like we know this person, the better chance they have of being selected.
- Remember that you're writing for a young audience. Be descriptive! Help students imagine this person and their surroundings.
- We will not penalize for incorrect spelling or grammar. Tell your story! Don't worry about perfection.
- Submit early. We will hold two rounds of selection. Any submission not chosen during the first round will remain eligible for the second round.

## Submission/Selection Process

- All forms must be submitted by the deadline.
- A team of adult volunteers will assist the Youth Art Team by reviewing all submissions for appropriateness and completeness before forwarding them to the students. Incomplete forms will not be considered.
- Youth Art Team students will review the submissions and recommend the recipients and alternates they deem most worthy for the award based on the criteria. Recommendations will be forwarded to student collaborators for final approval.
- If you submit the name of a living person, you will both be notified if they are selected for the gallery. All submissions, whether chosen for the gallery or not, may be included in a publication and you will both be notified. Each individual will have the opportunity to withdraw at the time of notification. If we cannot reach you, the submission will be disqualified.
- Incomplete forms or forms received after the deadline will not be considered.

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### TIPS:

- **Choose someone you know well.** You may submit anyone like friends, family, neighbors, mentors, coworkers of any age – kids are eligible! Kids are eligible! In fact, we strongly encourage kids to complete submission forms, too.
- **Write for kids.** Young artists ages 6-16 are your audience. They will read the stories you write, and they will choose who to represent in the gallery. Be descriptive and help young people imagine the world of the person you're submitting.

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*Some questions to help you get started..*

**LOVE**

- How do they show they care about you or other people?
- Describe a sacrifice this person has made for another person.
- What small things has this person done that have made a bigger impact?

**POWER**

- In what ways does this person inspire others?
- Tell a story about a time they made another person feel safe.
- What have they done to change your life or the lives of other people?

**GREATNESS**

- What do they say to be funny?
- Tell this person's beautiful story, journey, or adventure.
- Describe a time when this person was selfless.

**SHADOW**

- Will you tell a story about a time when they were afraid. How did they overcome their fear?
- Describe a time when this person took a risk – something that could cause them pain or pose a threat.
- How has this person tackled the "dark" by adding "light"?

**FIGHT**

- How does this person show strength and grit?
- Describe a time when this person stood up for another person or something they believed in.
- Will you tell a story about a time when this person had to keep going, even though it was hard?
